POST POST-COLONIAL DYSTOPIA IN MANJULA PADMANABHAN'S HARVEST

ABSTRACT

Dystopian world projected by Manjula Padmanabhan in Harvest is replete with poverty, prostitution, organ trade, oppression of Third World countries and suppression of women. While the economic globalization improved the living standards of the people in the Global North, the Global South was exploited in several ways. A new type of colonization gripped the developing countries that struggled to rise after the colonial rule and this new colonization was very harmful and surreptitious. This is the context of the play, Harvest. The poor family of Om, his wife, Jaya, Om's brother, Jeetu and Om's mother struggle for their existence in Bombay. The conditions become worse when Om loses his job. He agrees to donate his body to a corporate company. Jeetu, who lives by prostitution, is unable to support the family. Through the live of Om and Jaya, Manjula Padnamabhan shows how the poor are lured into organ trade and how they live under the surveillance of a corporate company, Interplanta Services Inc. The physical fitness of the donor, Om, is tested. Om hides the truth that he gets married and joins the company. He is even monitored carefully through a videotape inside his own house. The company has the complete authority over his body and whenever a person in the First World is in need of an organ, then it will be taken from his body. The donors are not even aware of which organ will be removed from them. The play shows the dystopian world in the developing countries in the post-colonial period.

The period after de-colonization compelled the colonised countries to look for the effects of colonial rule in social, political and economic realms. The post-colonial studies analysed and debated the issues regarding colonization, more specifically the Euro-Centric colonization. The colonization had a strong blow upon these countries and they struggled to stabilize on their own. New strategies and plans had to be made to alleviate their social condition and these countries again turned towards developed countries and international agencies for funds. International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank offered huge amounts to these nations with conditions attached. The developing countriesagreed to join the competitive market-driven economic globalization as per the directive of these funding agencies and made structural adjustments. By the end of twentieth century, the developing countries, most of which were the former colonies, faced a new kind of challenge. Unable to pay the foreign debt and the crisis that followed, these countries accepted interventions in political and economic realms. With the changes in the capitalist world system and the rise of economic globalization, a new kind of colonization gripped these countries, which were







Aside from a diverse collection of historical slave narratives Morrison's 'Beloved' presents a unique narrative structure. It argues the multifaceted trauma, displayed by a loss of time. Sethe is a real person in the story haunted by her terrible past but trying to get by in the world that is a little better, but still keeps her trapped by her previous life. The damage done to Sethe and the other slaves did not end just because they escaped or were later freed. It continued to affect them spiritually, physically and psychologically. Morrison shows this through Sethe's magical connection to her baby and to her connection to her daughter Denver. This paper adopts psychological approach, by focusing the character of mother and daughter and some incidents that occurred in a great part of the novel.




Abstract:




ABSTRACT


Abstract:


Abstract:


Abstract:


ABSTRACT


Abstract




Abstract

Cloud computing providers deliver the applications via internet, which are accessed from web browsers, desktop and mobile apps. Cloud Computing Technologies services are majorly grouped into 3 categories: they are, SaaS (Software as a

Service), IaaS (Infrastructure as a Service), and PaaS(Platform as a Service). SaaS (Software as a Service) is an on-demand application service [6][7].

He voiced against devadasi system, child marriage and the traditional norms that bind women to chastity, marriage, child rearing and enslavement dictated by the male patriarchy and caste/community norms. His book "Penn Yen Adimayanal" and the famous self-respect conference held in Chengalpattu in 1929 laid a strong ideological base for women's emancipation.




ABSTRACT

During the Muslim period, female education still deteriorated due to the evil practice of purdah. However, during the Buddhism and Jainism movement, certain lady saint- scholars flourished. During the British period female education got only lip service from the Government. It was private bodies and missionaries who took more initiative for the qualitative and quantitative development of female education. During this period, female education was concentrated in urban areas and there were hardly any schools for women in rural areas. Consequently, in pre-independent India the level of education in general and of female education in particular was very low. After independence, there has been spectacular progress of education due to universalisation of primary education. MINING VIDEO SEQUENCES FOR THE EFFICIENT PREDICTION OF USER BEHAVIOR

ABSTRACT

Analysis of user behaviors in large video databases is an emergent problem. The growing importance of video in every day life (ex. Movie production) increases automatically the importance of video usage. To be able to cope with the abundance of available videos, users of these videos need intelligent software systems that fully utilize the rich source information hidden in user behaviors on large video data bases for retrieving and navigating through videos. In this paper, we present a framework for video usage mining to generate user profiles on a video search engine in the context of movie production. We propose a two level model based approach for modeling user behaviors on a video search engine. The first level aims at modeling and clustering user behavior on a single video sequence (intra video behavior), the second one aims at modeling and clustering user behavior on a set of video sequences (inter video behavior). Based on this representation we have developed a two phase clustering algorithm that fits these data. First results obtained from test dataset show that taking into account intra-video behavior to cluster inter-video behavior produces more meaningfulresults.

Introduction

With the fast development in video capture, storage and distribution technologies, digital videos are more accessible than ever. The amount of these archives is increasing at analyzing rate. To deal with it, video usage mining, which aims at analyzing user behaviors on a set of video data, is one of the key technologies to create suitable tools to help people browsing and searching the large amount of video data. Indeed, like in web mining field the extracted information will enable to improve videoaccesses.




Figure 1. Overview of the video usage mining framework.

In this paper, we present a framework [fig. 1] that combines intra-video usage mining and inter-video usage mining to generate user profiles on a video search engine in the context of movie production. Specifically, we have borrowed the idea of navigation history from web browsers used in web usage mining, and propose a novel approach that defines two types of log from the log data gathered on a video search engine. The first one concerns the way a user views a video sequence (play, pause, forward. ...) and can be called intra-video usage mining. At this level we define the "video sequence viewing" as a behavior unit. The second type of log tracks the transitions between each video sequence viewing. This part regroups requests, results and successive viewed sequences. At this higher level, like in web mining we introduce a "session" like a behaviorunit.

This paper is organized as follows. In section 2, we present the related work in video usage mining. Section 3 presents ourtwo level model based approach for modeling users' behaviors on a video search engine. Finally, section 4 describes the evaluation of the technique on some test datasets, and section 5 gives the conclusion and some future directions.




