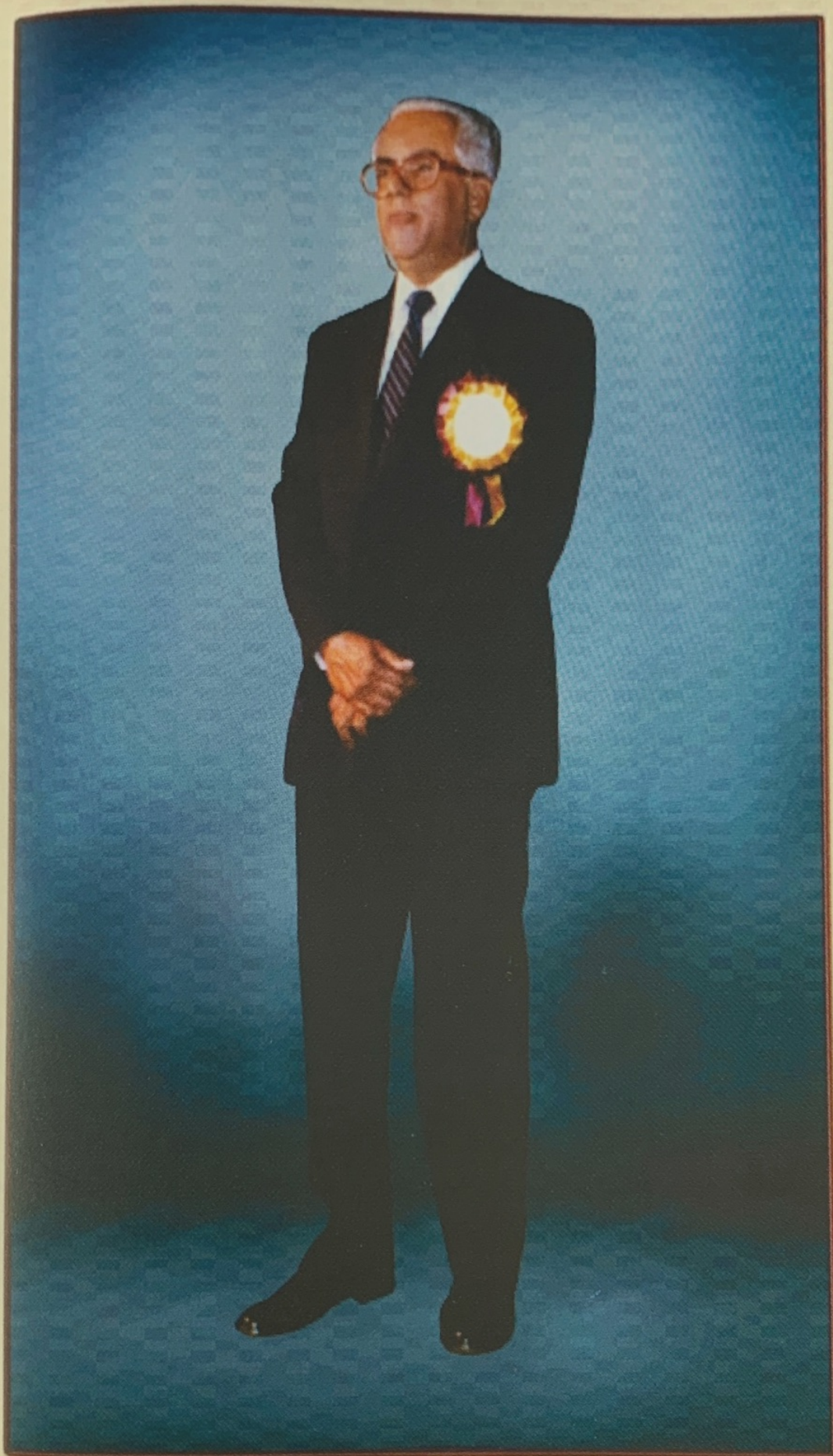

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Soka Ikeda College of Arts and Science for Women is founded by our Chairman, Dr. Sethu Kumanan. Under his visionary and leadership, and with his determination to serve humanity, this pioneering institution for women was established in the village of Madhanangkuppam, with the main focus on empowering women through value based education.

The education system is modeled after Soka Education System. The word 'Soka' is from Japanese language, which means "to create value", was formulated by Tsunesaburo Makiguchi in 1930, along with his other profound teaching pedagogies. Soka Education system is based on virtue and peace and seeks to nurture the latent talents of the students while laying a strong foundation on values. This value based education was followed by Josei Toda and then by Dr. Daisaku Ikeda, who is the Honorary Founder of the College.

Dr. Daisaku Ikeda, is a world renowned Educator, prodigious writer, Buddhist Philosopher, Photographer, Poet of Eminence and is an epitome of Peace. He is the founder of Soka University (Tokyo), Soka Women's College (Tokyo), Soka University of America (USA) and the Soka Schools.

In recognition of Dr. Ikeda's accomplishments, various institutions have honoured him with awards, such as the United Nations Peace Award, the Poet Laureate Award by the World Poets Association. He has been regarded as "One of the greatest leaders of the 20th Century" by the University of Delhi and awarded him, "The Doctorate of Letters" in January 1999. Bharathidasan University conferred the Honorary Doctorate of Letters to Dr. Ikeda in 2002. Besides, he is also the proud recipient of Jamnalal Bajaj International Awards in 2005 for promoting Gandhian values across the world. Dr. Ikeda has been awarded 397 honorary doctorates, many professorships and equivalent honours from various Universities across the world in recognition of his efforts to promote peace. With the motivation and support rendered by our Honorary Founder, college has been steadily growing in the path of creating empowered women for more than two decades.

Soka Ikeda College of Arts and Science for Women (SICASW) has gloriously embarked into twenty second year with many accolades and achievements since its inception in 2000. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Classes for Shift I begins at 9 am and continue till 2.15 pm with a lunch break of half-an-hour from 11.55 am to 12.25 pm and for Shift II the classes begins at 12.00 noon and ends at 5 pm with a break of ten minutes between 2.15 pm and 2.25 pm.

Day Order system is followed and each working day is divided into 5 academic periods followed by a period allotted for para-academic activities.

Attendance is taken every hour and if a student is absent for one hour in the forenoon or afternoon session, she will be marked absent for that entire session.

A student must have a minimum of 75% attendance to appear for the University Examinations.

Students who wish to avail leave must submit leave application in advance duly signed by the parent/guardian to the respective class teacher. However, in case of emergency, the leave form can be submitted on the day, when the student returns to the college.

Students should apply for leave only in the given prescribed form (each student will be given 5 copies of leave forms per semester). Further copies of leave forms can be obtained from the office at a cost of Rs.5/- each.

When a student avails leave for illness, she should produce Medical Certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner along with the leave form.

Students must avoid availing leave during Internal Assessment Examination.

Students should be punctual to the class. Late attendance is considered as absence for the period and thereby absent for the whole session.

It is obligatory on the part of each and every student to adhere to the rules and regulations of the college for maintaining good standard, discipline and decorum. They should conduct themselves properly both within and outside the college premises.

The students should not be absent for the special/coaching classes conducted for their benefit.

Strict silence should be observed during the class hours and when classes are dismissed, students should move from one class to another in an orderly manner without causing disturbance to other classes.

Students should update themselves with the notification put up on the notice board from time to time.

Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the college premises neat and clean.

Every student should try to emulate the principles of great personalities and aim to achieve success and perfection in all their endeavors. The conduct, character, behavior and the progress in studies of each student should be satisfactory.

In case of any emergency, the student shall be permitted to leave the college campus only with the accompaniment of the parent and a gate pass duly signed by the Principal.

No communication will be entertained from anyone other than the parents - either through telephone or letter. Change of residence and mobile number of parent/guardian, if any, should be intimated to the class in-charge/HOD.

The students should pay their semester fees within the last date for payment of semester fees as mentioned in the college calendar. For delayed payment, a penalty of Rs. 200/- will be collected.

Students are responsible of their belongings and should avoid bringing valuable articles to the college. The management, principal and staff are not responsible for the loss of any belongings of the student inside the college campus.

If a student, after completion of one or two years of study, wants to get transfer certificate in the beginning of the next year even without attending the class, she has to pay full fees to the college for the remaining period of the course. A student who discontinues in the middle of the semester should pay the fees for the entire course to get the transfer certificate.

Breach of any of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action. The management seeks kind co-operation of the parents/guardian in this regard to help the college to do its best for the students.

STUDENTS SHOULD NOT BRING MOBILE PHONES TO COLLEGE

EXAMINATION

Each department conducts periodical tests for the students apart from two internal assessments and a model examination conducted in common for all the students each semester on university examination pattern. Attendance for all the students in all these examinations is compulsory. The monthly attendance secured by the students will be informed to the parent/guardian along with their performance in the Internal Assessment Test. The parent/guardian must carefully read the report and advise their wards suitably. In case of loss of report card, student should avail a new report card on payment of Rs.100/-.

IDENTITY CARD

Each student will be given a college identity card at the beginning of the first year. The student must strictly wear the identity card inside the college premises failing which they will not be permitted to attend the class. In the event of loss of ID card, students can get a new ID card from the college office on payment of Rs.200/-.

No member shall take any printed book or notebook into the library without the permission of the librarian.

At the end of each semester, students should return the book and get the no due from the librarian. Photocopying and internet facility is available in the library. Strict silence should be maintained in the library. A fine of Rs.2/- per day (including holidays) will be levied for late return of book.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Classes for Shift I begins at 9 am and continue till 2.15 pm with a lunch break of half-an-hour from 11.55 am to 12.25 pm and for Shift II the classes begins at 12.00 noon and ends at 5 pm with a break of ten minutes between 2.15 pm and 2.25 pm.

Day order system is followed and each working day is divided into 3 academic periods followed by a period allotted for para-academic activities.

Attendance is taken every hour and if a student is absent for one hour in the forenoon or afternoon session she will be marked absent for that entire session.

A student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance to appear for the University Examinations.

Students who wish to avail leave must submit leave application in advance, duly signed by the parent/guardian, to the respective class teacher. However, in case of emergency, the leave form should be submitted on the day she returns back to the college.

Students should apply for leave only in the given prescribed form (each student will be given 5 copies of leave forms per semester). Further copies of leave forms can be obtained from the office at a cost of Rs.5/- each.

When a student avails leave for illness, she should produce Medical Certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner along with the leave form.

Leave forms and medical certificate submitted cannot be taken as an excuse for absenting themselves for Internal Assessment Examination.

CODE, CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students should be punctual to the class. Late attendance is considered as absence for the period and thereby absent for the whole session.

It is obligatory on the part of each and every student to adhere to the rules and regulations of the college for maintaining good standard, discipline and decorum. They should conduct themselves properly both within and outside the college premises.

The students should not be absent for the special/coaching classes conducted for their benefit.

Strict silence should be observed during the class hours and when classes are dismissed, students should move from one class to another in an orderly manner without causing disturbance to other classes.

Students should update themselves with the notification put up on the notice board from time to time.

Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the college premises neat and clean.

Every student should try to emulate the principles of great personalities and aim to achieve success and perfection in all their endeavours. The conduct, character, behaviour and the progress in studies of each student should be satisfactory.

In case of any emergency, the student shall be permitted to leave the college campus only with the accompaniment of the parent and a gate pass duly signed by the Principal, after submission of permission letter to the respective Head of the Department.

No communication will be entertained from anyone other than the parents – either through telephone or letter. Change of residence and mobile number of parent/guardian, if any, should be intimated to the class in-charge/HOD.

The students should pay their semester fees within the last date for payment of semester fees as mentioned in the college calendar. For delayed payment, a penalty of Rs.100/- will be collected.

Bus fees should be remitted on the first week of June for the Odd semester and in the first week of December for the Even semester.

Students are asked not to wear expensive jewellery and accessories/valuables and bring heavy cash. The management, Principal and staff shall not be responsible for the loss of any belongings of the student inside the college campus.

If a student, after completion of one or two years of study, wants to get transfer certificate in the beginning of the next year even without attending the class, she has to pay full fees to the college for the remaining period of the course. A student who discontinues in the middle of the semester should pay the fees for the entire course to get the transfer certificate.

Breach of any of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action. The management seeks kind co-operation of the parents/guardian in this regard to help the college to do its best for the students.

EXAMINATION

Each department conducts periodical tests for the students apart from two internal assessments and a Model examination conducted in common for all the students each semester on university examination pattern. Attendance for all the students in all these examinations is compulsory. The monthly attendance secured by the students will be informed to the parent/guardian along with their performance in the Internal Assessment Test. The parent / guardian must carefully read the report and advise their wards suitably. In case of loss of report card, student should avail a new report card on payment of Rs.100/-.

IDENTITY CARD

Each student will be given a college identity card at the beginning of the first year. The student must strictly wear the identity card inside the college premises failing which they will not be permitted to attend the class. In the event of loss of ID card, students can get a new ID card from the college office on payment of Rs.60/-.

Apart from community based Government Scholarships, merit based Tamilnadu Educational Trust Scholarship, Endowment Scholarship, Jaigopal Garaodia Scholarship, Sitaram Jindal Scholarship, Help the Blind Foundation Scholarship for visually Impaired Students, District Differently Abled Scholarship, National Scholarship for Persons with Disabilities are also available for meritorious students.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

All students are members of the Department of Physical Education. Following are the Sports and games conducted in our college: Athletics – (Field & Track Events), Football, Volleyball, Kho-Kho, Basketball, Handball and Throwball.

Books must not be marked or defaced. If a student damages or misuses the library books, she should pay penalty.

Student should examine each book before borrowing it and report to the library staff.

Periodicals placed on the magazine rack should not be mishandled. It should be placed on the rack after use. Periodicals and magazines are for reference only.

No member shall take any printed book or notebook into the library without the permission of the librarian.

At the end of each semester, students should return the book and get the no due from the librarian.

Photocopying and internet facility is available in the library. Strict silence should be maintained in the library.

A fine of Rs.2/- per day (including holidays) will be levied for late return of book.

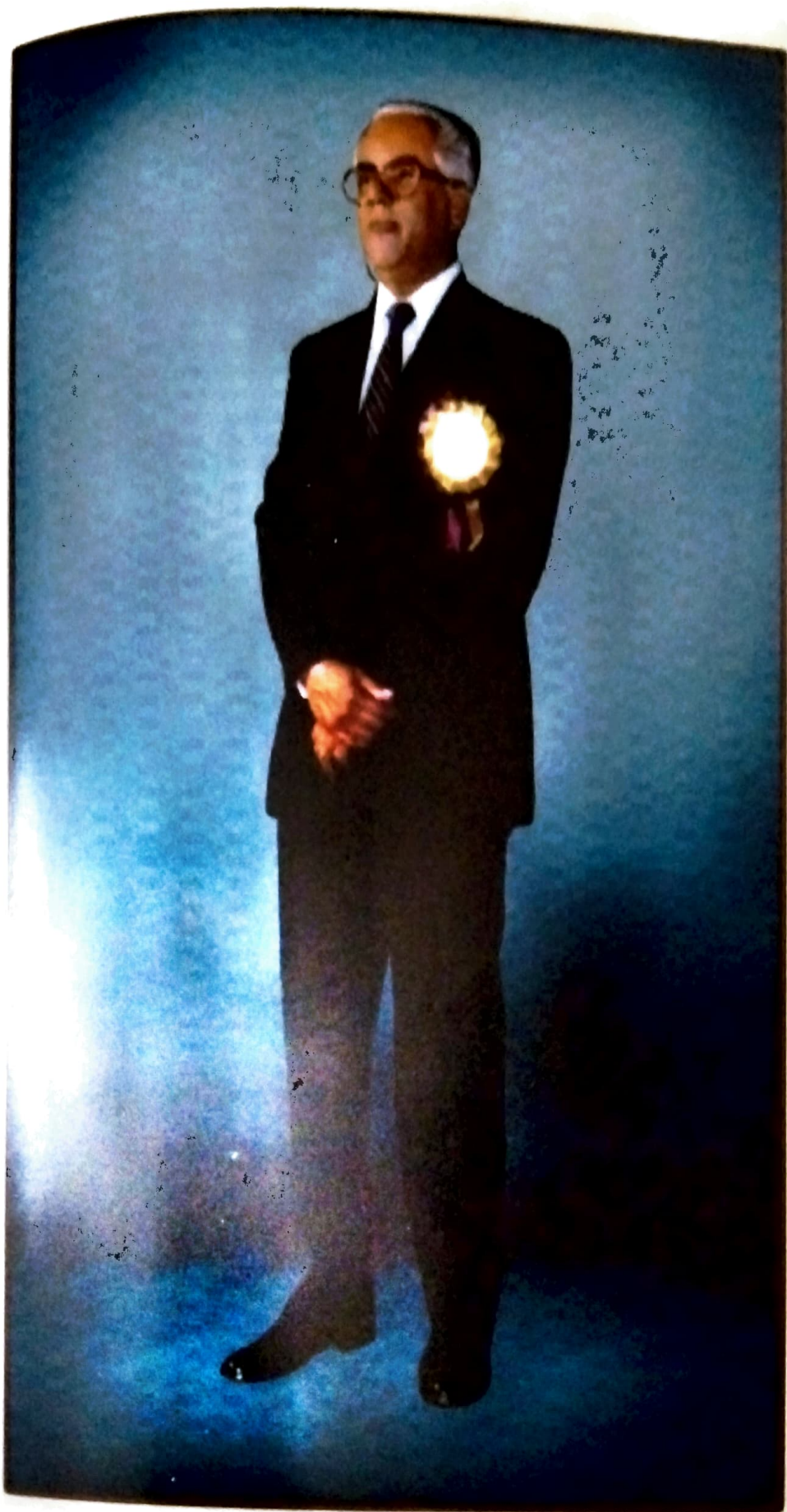

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Soka Ikeda College of Arts and Science for Women is a noble dream of the Chairman, Dr. Sethu Kumaran. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Classes for Shift I begins at 9 am and continue till 2.15 pm with a lunch break of half-an-hour from 11.55 am to 12.25 pm and for Shift II the classes begins at 12.00 noon and ends at 5 pm with a break of ten minutes between 2.15 pm and 2.25 pm.

Day order system is followed and each working day is divided into 5 academic periods followed by a period allotted for para-academic activities.

Attendance is taken every hour and if a student is absent for one hour in the forenoon or afternoon session she will be marked absent for that entire session.

A student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance to appear for the University Examinations.

Students who want to avail leave must submit leave application in advance, duly signed by the parent/guardian, to the respective class teacher. However, in case of emergency, the leave form should be submitted on the day she returns back to the college.

Students should apply for leave only in the given prescribed form (each student will be given 5 copies of leave forms per semester). Further copies of leave forms can be obtained from the office at a cost of Rs.5/- each.

When a student avails leave for illness, she should produce Medical Certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner along with the leave form.

Leave forms and medical certificate submitted cannot be taken as an excuse for absenting themselves for Internal Assessment Examination.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students should be punctual to the class. Late attendance is considered as absence for the period and thereby absent for the whole session.

It is obligatory on the part of each and every student to adhere to the rules and regulations of the college for maintaining good standard, discipline and decorum. They should conduct themselves properly both within and outside the college premises.

The students should not be absent for the special/coaching classes conducted for their benefit.

Strict silence should be observed during the class hours and when classes are dismissed, students should move from one class to another in an orderly manner without causing disturbance to other classes.

Students should update themselves with the notification put up on the notice board from time to time.

Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the college premises neat and clean.

Every student should try to emulate the principles of great personalities and aim to achieve success and perfection in all their endeavours. The conduct, character, behaviour and the progress in studies of each student should be satisfactory.

In case of any emergency, the student shall be permitted to leave the college campus only with the accompaniment of the parent and a gate pass duly signed by the Principal, after submission of permission letter to the respective Head of the Department.

No communication will be entertained from anyone other than the parents – either through telephone or letter.

Change of residence and mobile number of parent/guardian, if any, should be intimated to the class in-charge/HOD.

The students should pay their semester fees within the last date for payment of semester fees as mentioned in the college calendar. For delayed payment, a penalty of Rs.100/- will be collected.

Bus fees should be remitted on the first week of June for the Odd semester and in the first week of December for the Even semester.

Students are asked not to wear expensive jewellery and accessories/valuables and bring heavy cash. The management, Principal and staff shall not be responsible for the loss of any belongings of the student inside the college campus.

If a student, after completion of one or two years of study, wants to get transfer certificate in the beginning of the next year even without attending the class, she has to pay full fees to the college for the remaining period of the course. A student who discontinues in the middle of the semester should pay the fees for the entire course to get the transfer certificate.

Students are not permitted to carry mobile phones/i-pods/camera inside the campus. A fine of Rs.1000/- will be levied if she is found to possess any one of these items.

Breach of any of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action. The management seeks kind co-operation of the parents/guardian in this regard to help the college to do its best for the students.

EXAMINATION

Each department conducts periodical tests for the students and the college conducts two internal assessment test and a Model examination for all the students each semester on university examination question paper pattern. Attendance for all the students in all these examinations is compulsory. The monthly attendance secured by the students will be informed to the parent/ guardian along with their performance in the Internal Assessment Test. The parent / guardian must carefully read the report and advice their wards suitably. In case of loss of report card, student should avail a new report card on payment of Rs.100/-.

IDENTITY CARD

Each student will be given a college identity card at the beginning of the first year. The student must strictly wear the identity card inside the college premises failing which they will not be permitted to attend the class. In the event of loss of ID card, students can get a new ID card from the college office on payment of Rs.60/-.

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Classes for Shift I begins at 9 am and continue till 2.15 pm with a lunch break of half-an-hour from 11.55 am to 12.25 pm and for Shift II the classes begins at 12.00 noon and ends at 5 pm with a break of ten minutes between 2.15 pm and 2.25 pm.

Day order system is followed and each working day is divided into 5 academic periods followed by a period allotted for para-academic activities.

Attendance is taken every hour and if a student is absent for one hour in the forenoon or afternoon session she will be marked absent for that entire session.

A student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance to appear for the University Examinations.

Students who want to avail leave must submit leave application in advance, duly signed by the parent/guardian, to the respective class teacher. However, in case of emergency, the leave form should be submitted on the day she returns back to the college.

Students should apply for leave only in the given prescribed form (each student will be given 5 copies of leave forms per semester). Further copies of leave forms can be obtained from the office at a cost of Rs.5/- each.

When a student avails leave for illness, she should produce Medical Certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner along with the leave form.

Leave forms and medical certificate submitted cannot be taken as an excuse for absenting themselves for Internal Assessment Examination.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students should be punctual to the class. Late attendance is considered as absence for the period and thereby absent for the whole session.

It is obligatory on the part of each and every student to adhere to the rules and regulations of the college for maintaining good standard, discipline and decorum. They should conduct themselves properly both within and outside the college premises.

The students should not be absent for the special/coaching classes conducted for their benefit.

Strict silence should be observed during the class hours and when classes are dismissed, students should move from one class to another in an orderly manner without causing disturbance to other classes.

Students should update themselves with the notification put up on the notice board from time to time.

Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the college premises neat and clean.

Every student should try to emulate the principles of great personalities and aim to achieve success and perfection in all their endeavours. The conduct, character, behaviour and the progress in studies of each student should be satisfactory.

In case of any emergency, the student shall be permitted to leave the college campus only with the accompaniment of the parent and a gate pass duly signed by the Principal, after submission of permission letter to the respective Head of the Department.

No communication will be entertained from anyone other than the parents – either through telephone or letter.

Change of residence and mobile number of parent/guardian, if any, should be intimated to the class in-charge/HOD.

The students should pay their semester fees within the last date for payment of semester fees as mentioned in the college calendar. For delayed payment, a penalty of Rs.100/- will be collected.

Bus fees should be remitted on the first week of June for the Odd semester and in the first week of December for the Even semester.

Students are asked not to wear expensive jewellery and accessories/valuables and bring heavy cash. The management, Principal and staff shall not be responsible for the loss of any belongings of the student inside the college campus.

If a student, after completion of one or two years of study, wants to get transfer certificate in the beginning of the next year even without attending the class, she has to pay full fees to the college for the remaining period of the course. A student who discontinues in the middle of the semester should pay the fees for the entire course to get the transfer certificate.

Students are not permitted to carry mobile phones/i-pods/camera inside the campus. A fine of Rs.1000/- will be levied if she is found to possess any one of these items.

Breach of any of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action. The management seeks kind co-operation of the parents/guardian in this regard to help the college to do its best for the students.

EXAMINATION

Each department conducts periodical tests for the students and the college conducts two internal assessment test and a Model examination for all the students each semester on university examination question paper pattern. Attendance for all the students in all these examinations is compulsory. The monthly attendance secured by the students will be informed to the parent/ guardian along with their performance in the Internal Assessment Test. The parent / guardian must carefully read the report and advice their wards suitably. In case of loss of report card, student should avail a new report card on payment of Rs.100/-.

IDENTITY CARD

Each student will be given a college identity card at the beginning of the first year. The student must strictly wear the identity card inside the college premises failing which they will not be permitted to attend the class. In the event of loss of ID card, students can get a new ID card from the college office on payment of Rs.60/-.

The library is open to all the members of the college. A student on being enrolled in the college becomes a member of the college library. Student should take the books by using ID card (Bar Code System).

Library rules:

Books must not be marked or defaced. If a student damages or misuses the library books, she should pay penalty.

Student should examine each book before borrowing it and report to the library staff.

Periodicals placed on the magazine rack should not be mishandled. It should be placed on the rack after use. Periodicals and magazines are for reference only.

No member shall take any printed book or notebook into the library without the permission of the librarian.

At the end of each semester, students should return the book and get the no due from the librarian.

Photocopying and internet facility is available in the library. Strict silence should be maintained in the library.

A fine of Rs.2/- per day (including holidays) will be levied for late return of book.

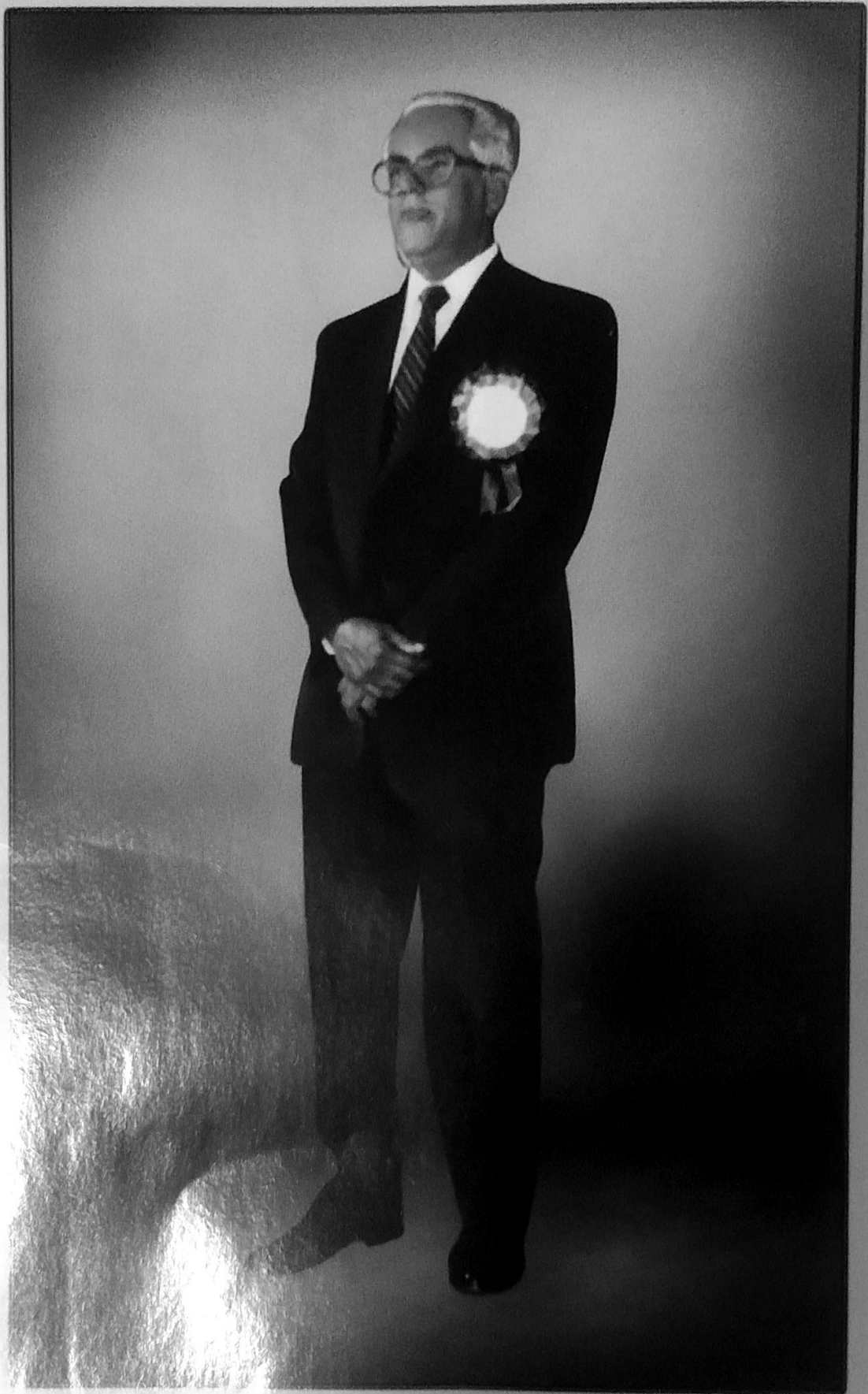

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Classes begin from 09.00 a.m. to 2.15 p.m. with lunch break between 11.55 a.m. and 12.25 p.m. on day order system for shift I and for shift II the classes begin at 12.00 noon and end at 5.00 p.m. with a break of 10 minutes between 2.15 p.m. and 2.25 p.m.

Each working day is divided into 5 academic periods followed by a period allotted for para-academic activities.

Attendance will be taken every hour and a student who is absent for one hour in the forenoon or afternoon session will be marked absent for that entire session.

A student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance to appear for the University Examinations.

Students who want to avail leave to submit their leave application preferably in advance to the respective class teachers. However on emergency, the leave letter should be submitted on the day. She returns back to the college with signatures of the class teacher and head of the department.

Students should apply for leave only in the prescribed form available in the office. Each student is given 5 copies of leave forms per semester. Further copies of leave form can be obtained from the office at the cost of Rs.5/- each.

When a student avails leave for illness, she should produce Medical Certificate from a registered medical practitioner with leave form.

Leave letters and medical certificate offered as excuse for the absence for Internal Assessment test will not be accepted.

IDENTITY CARD

Each student will be issued with the college identity card immediately upon admission. The student must strictly wear the identity card inside the college premises failing which they will not be permitted to attend the class. In the event of loss of ID cards students should procure a new ID card on payment of Rs. 25/-.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students should be punctual to the classes. Late attendance will lead to marking the student absent for the period and thereby absent for the whole session.

It is obligatory on the part of each and every student to adhere to the rules and regulations of the college for maintaining good standard, discipline and decorum. They should conduct themselves properly both within and outside the college premises.

The students should not absent themselves for the special/coaching classes, conducted for their benefit.

Strict silence should be observed during the class hours in the college premises. When classes are dismissed, students should move from one class to another in an orderly manner without causing disturbance to other classes.

Students should update themselves with the notification put up on the notice board from time to time.

Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the college premises neat and clean.

Every student shall try to emulate the principled ways of life of great personalities and aim to achieve success and perfection in all their endeavours. The conduct, character, behavior and the progress in studies of each student should be satisfactory.

In case of any emergency, the student shall be permitted to leave the college campus only with the accompaniment of the parent and a gate pass duly signed by the Principal, after submission of permission letter to the respective Head of the Department.

No communication will be entertained from anyone other than the parents - either through telephone or letters.

Change of residence and mobile number of parents and guardian if any should be intimated to the HOD/class in-charge.

The students should pay their semester fees within the last date for payment of semester fees as mentioned in the college calendar. For a delayed payment a fine of Rs.100/- per day will be collected.

Bus fees should be remitted on the first week of June for the Odd Semester and in the first week of December for the Even Semester.

Students are requested not to wear heavy or expensive jewellery and accessories. Students are requested not to carry valuables and heavy cash. The management, Principal and staff shall not be responsible for the loss of any belongings of the student.

If a student after completion of one year or two years of study wants to have transfer certificate in the beginning of next year even without attending the classes, she has to pay full fees to the college for the remaining period of the course. A student who discontinues in the middle of the semester should pay the fees for the entire course to get the transfer certificate.

Students are not permitted to carry mobile phones/I -pods/ camera inside the campus. A fine of Rs.1000/- will be levied for a student if she is found to possess any one these items and never be returned back.

Breach of any of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action. The management seeks the kind cooperation of the parents/ guardians in this regard to help the college to do its best for the students.

All students are members of the Department of Physical Education.

The Director of Physical Education will carry on the activities of the department under the direction and guidance of the Principal.

The teams will be selected as per the norms stipulated by the sports committee.

Sports and games like Athletics - (Field & Track Events), Football, Volleyball, Kho-Kho, Basketball, Handball, Throwball are undergone in our College.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

Two units of NSS with 200 students are functioning in the college. It is under the control of two programme officers, who are conducting the activities of the NSS as per the rules stipulated by the University of Madras. The overall objective of the NSS is the personality development of the students through community service.

Red Ribbon Club functions with the sole purpose of creating awareness and prevention of HIV through campaigns.

YOUTH RED CROSS

The Youth Red Cross of the College is rendering remarkable service to the Society by organizing blood donation camps, contributing to adult literacy, collecting medicines and distributing them to the needy people and assisting the sick people in hospitals. There are 200 volunteers in YRC. The volunteers get a lot of training in natural disaster management and involve themselves in the rescue activities of natural disasters. As a measure of improving the protection, the volunteers are trained in self-defense method. The trained volunteers train other students in self-defense.

ROTARACT

The Rotaract Club of our college is governed by the Rotary Club of Aarch City Madras (RI district 3232) and this club focuses on medical camps, blood donation camps, environmental awareness and allied service oriented programmes.

NCC

This service forum focuses on to develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens. Creating a human resource of organized trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life including the Armed Forces and be always available for the service of the nation.

ENACTUS

Enactus is an international non-profit organization that works with leaders in business and higher education to mobilize students and to develop the skills to become responsible business leaders. Students apply business concepts which are available to them, through which they improve the quality of life and standard of living for people in need. This programme helps them to develop the business skills and thereby work for the community at large. The Enactus club offers Driving and Tailoring classes to the staff and students for the empowerment of women. The Club also offers Central Government & State Government courses for the student's enhancement in the various activities like Glass Painting, Mehendi, Tiles Painting, Jardhosi Work in Blouse.

EXAMINATION

Each department conducts periodical tests for the students in various disciplines. The college will conduct two Internal Assessment tests and Model Examination for all the students in each semester on University Examination question paper pattern. Attendance for all the students in all these examinations is compulsory. The monthly attendance secured by the students will be informed to the parent/guardian along with their performance in the Internal Assessment test. The parent/guardian must carefully read the reports and advise their wards suitably. In case of loss of report card students should avail a new card on payment of Rs.100/-.

STUDENTS' UNION

Students' union is selected every year to mediate between the Management and students. It gives opportunity to students to have their leadership qualities. Union plays an important role in executing college activities.

COUNSELING SYSTEM

This cell is an integral part of this institution, wherein a group of students come under the care of the staff members, who pays individual attention to each and every student with regard to academic improvement, attendance, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Through this programme students get an opportunity to share their problems in personal and academic arena.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

Our college library has wonderful collections of books, magazines and journals. It contains near 10,630 books, covering a wide range of general and special subjects consisting of textbooks, reference books, back volumes of journals and project thesis etc. The college library is having international journals in the reference section, collection of nearly 1130 volumes of books by our Honorary Founder Dr. Daisaku Ikeda. Open access system is followed in our library for all books and closed access system for reference books and journals, magazine and periodicals.

The library is open to all the member of the college. A student on being enrolled in the college becomes a member of the college library. Students should take the books by using Library ID Card (Bar Code System).

Library Rules:

Books must not be marked or defaced. If the students damage or misuse the library books, they should pay penalty.

Students should examine each book before borrowing it and report to the library staff.

Periodicals placed on the magazine racks should not be mishandled. It should be placed on the racks after use. These are all the reference, not for issue.

Reference books and periodicals will not be lent; however the same will be available for reference within the library.

No member shall take any printed book or note book into the library without the permission of the librarian.

At the end of each semester, every student should return the book and get no due from the librarian.

Photocopying facility is also available in the library. Strict silence should be maintained in the library.

A fine of Rs.2 per day (including holidays) will be levied for late submission of books.

CAREER AND GUIDANCE CELL

The Cell provides guidance to the students of the College to improve their overall personalities and help them to meet challenges in their life. The Cell addresses the diverse Socio-economic challenges and geographic background of the heterogeneous group. Various services are provided by the cell such as Personal guidance, Educational guidance and Career guidance.
